The events of this year converged into a heartbreaking, heavy, and gripping movement that revealed long-standing problems at BU regarding sexual assault and sexual violence. The Sexual Culture Committee (SCC) has long been involved in education, action, and justice in the BU community before these events took place, but more than ever, this year, they mobilized, advocated, and directed concrete changes as generations of students decided was time was up. Below is a timeline of just snippets of the SCC's work this year:

September 26 - Pro-Choice March



The SCC marched alongside La Bande Féministe and other community members at Marché de la Gare in solidarity against an anti abortion protest taking place at the Family Planning Clinic in Sherbrooke.

October 20 - Take Back the Night Forum





The SCC, joined by CALACS, LDWC, the ICA, and Anika Malone, held a forum where students discussed topics including MMIWG, understanding why sexual assault is not reported, how Bishop's party culture affects its sexual culture, and initiatives to make students feel safer.

November 3



November 4- Silent Vigil






Reckoning with sexual assault and violence at Bishop's evoked many emotions, from fury to grief. But, on November 4th, Students chose that stand in silence with survivors who shared their message on the bridge.

November 12 - Walkout & McGreer





Students join the SCC in a walkout from classes at 3 PM. After convening in the Quad, they line the halls of McGreer during a Board of Governors meeting. After Security arrives, they are allowed to remain in the building so long as they keep fire exits clear. Five students are invited to the Board of Governors meeting to speak



The plan is overseen by the SRC Executives and the SCC, with support from the BSR.







November 19

The Senate passes a motion by the SCC and Dr. Stine Linden-Anderson for annual online training in the prevention of sexual violence.

January 2022 - New Subcommittees



The Sexual Education subcommittee worked to develop factual and inclusive sexual education, body positivity workshops, and more. The Policy Review subcommittee was tasked to implement the SRC's Sexual Assault Response and Prevention Action Plan and improve SRC hiring practices. The Mindful Masculinity and Male Engagement subcommittee sought to create safe spaces for male sharing, sensitivity, and emotion, aiming to lead positive masculinity workshops in CEGEPs and high schools in the future

February 12

The BSR passes the SRC Sexual Misconduct policy, written by the SCC's SRC Policies for Prevention and Response Subcommittee.

February 14- MMIWG2S Vigil



The Indigenous Cultural Alliance (ICA) and SCC host a vigil coinciding with the ICA's awareness campaign for MMIWG2S, an issue closely related to how sexual violence disproportionately affects Indigenous individuals, who face additional barriers to support and justice.

February 18 - REES Launch



The long-awaited launch of REES comes to Bishop's. The SCC spent over a year and a half spearheading the process of getting the online sexual violence reporting platform at Bishop's. Now, survivors can report on their terms, choosing whether or not they'd like to make an anonymous report, connect with campus resources, or report to the police.

March 4

The Sports Plex launches the Women and Gender Non-Conforming Workout Hours, an SCC initiative

March 20

The BSR passes the SRC Safer Spaces policy, written by the SCC's SRC Policies for Prevention and Response Subcommittee.

March 30 - Gaiter Gab



The Mindful Masculinity subcommittee hosts their first Gaiter Gab at Johnville Bog, 'a series that looks to create a comfortable setting for open conversations on gender, emotionality,' wrote Nicolas Masse in *The Campus*.





Apart from the SCC, other students, faculty, and members of the BU community have been essential in advancing the SCC's priorities and calls for reform. These developments include four town halls hosted by Dr. Stine Linden-Anderson, the engagement of an external investigator, the creation of an independent review panel that held Zoom consultations from February through March 2022, and the work of the Sexual Aggression Response Team, to name a few. On November 30, Giving Tuesday, the Alumni Association showed their support with a total of \$45,539 in donations to the SCC. Many members of the community have walked alongside students in protests, stood at the vigils, and participated in Town Halls, whether they be professors, Student Safety, or survivors. The fight to make Bishop's a safer place is ongoing.

The Gaiters breezed by the Ravens and Gee-Gees, staying undefeated the first half of their six-game regular season. They continued their impeccable winning streak at their home opener and final two regular-season games on Coulter Field, finishing the season 6-o. This put the Gaiters at the top of the CULFA East conference.
