CLASSROOM-FOCUSED

We believe that getting business people in the classroom is essential to giving our students a glimpse of the real-world. We look forward to having you share your experiences with our students.

GUEST LECTURE/PANEL/ROUND-TABLE

By being a guest lecturer, you can give students a glimpse of a real organization through the eyes of one of its stakeholders, you! Share your business experience from anywhere in the world while helping students link it back to the course-specific theories.

LIVE CASE STUDIES

Have a current business challenge that you are willing to share with our students? Students have the opportunity to hear about a real problem in all its complexity, then propose strategic recommendations before your eyes.

INTERVIEWS

Interviews are sometimes used by professors to have student take an in-depth look at a particular company or problem. Volunteer a small portion of time to sit one-on-one with our students and discuss their questions while the students link it back to theories in class.



COMMUNITY-FOCUSED

Collaborating with non-profit and other community organizations allows for mutually beneficial outcomes; a real win-win. An excellent option for organizations with a small project and requires extra help. Business students are engaged in volunteer activities in an organized way with non-profit community organizations that are directly related to their field of study for at least 15 hours.

VOLUNTEERING

Students may also choose to volunteer their time and expertise to a variety of organizations, clubs or individuals in a scheduled fashion or on an ad-hoc basis.



COMPANY-FOCUSED

We can all agree that students learn best by doing and testing ideas first-hand. Work-integrated learning is, in our opinion, the optimal method of integrating theory and practice in a real-life setting. This is where company partners like you, are key to the learning process.

APPLIED RESEARCH PROJECTS

Students are engaged in research that occurs primarily in organizations and can include consulting projects; design projects; community-based research projects. In this particular case, students work in for-profit organizations on specific projects, predominantly with small and medium sized businesses.

Students will provide business-consulting services to for-profit organizations based on the needs that are mutually determined by both the students and the organization. The student creates a needs analysis, provides strategic recommendations and present their results to the company.


