The Language Teaching Club is an organization started by a group of Education students in the Teaching-English-as-a-Second-Language Program at Bishop's University in 2011.

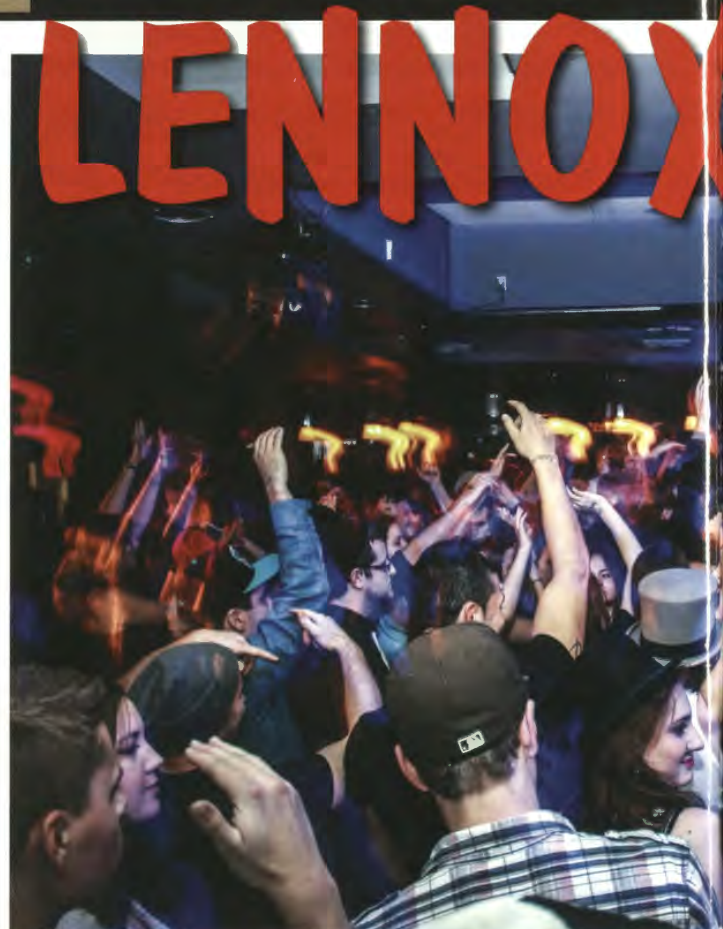
Our clubs mission is to create a community of Bishop's language teachers and learners.

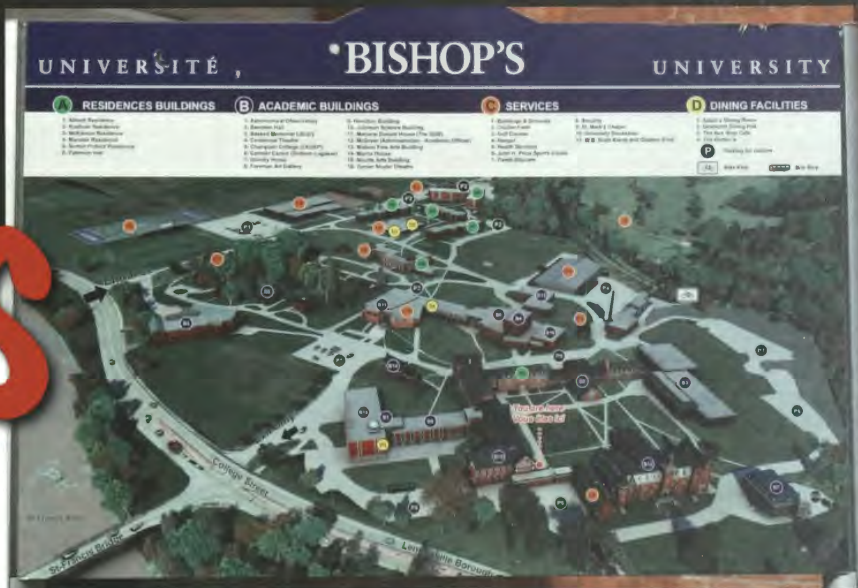

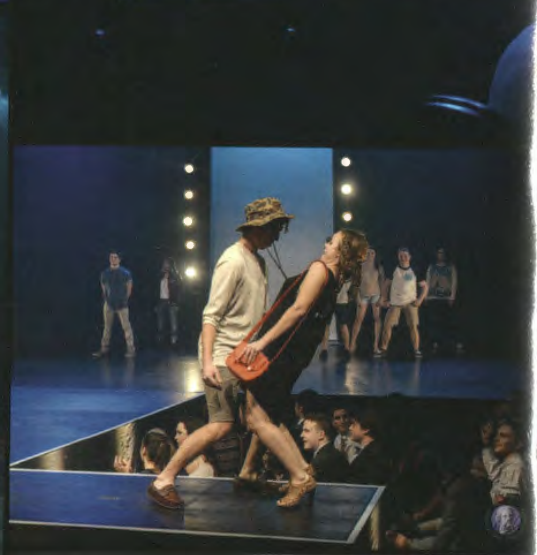

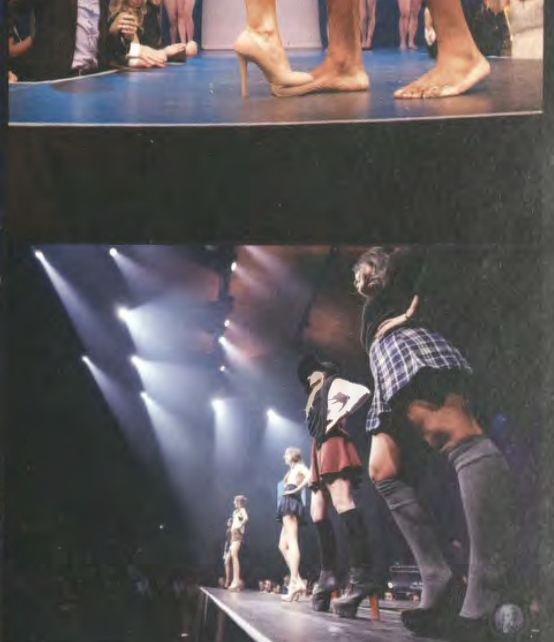
MUSE

Muse 2014 was the best show yet, both raising more money for charity than any student initiative before it, and providing a lasting creative image that will prove difficult for next years organizing committee to best. The event, taking place the night of Saturday, February 15th, saw over 600 students in attendance of a show featuring close to 90 models, 30 dancers, and a further backstage support staff of 14 organizing committee members and 30 volunteers. Highlights included a new stage layout that included a centre-stage entrance, runway, and runway-side VIP seating, as well as new scene choreography integrating dancers, stage light, and silhouette screens into the scenes themselves. 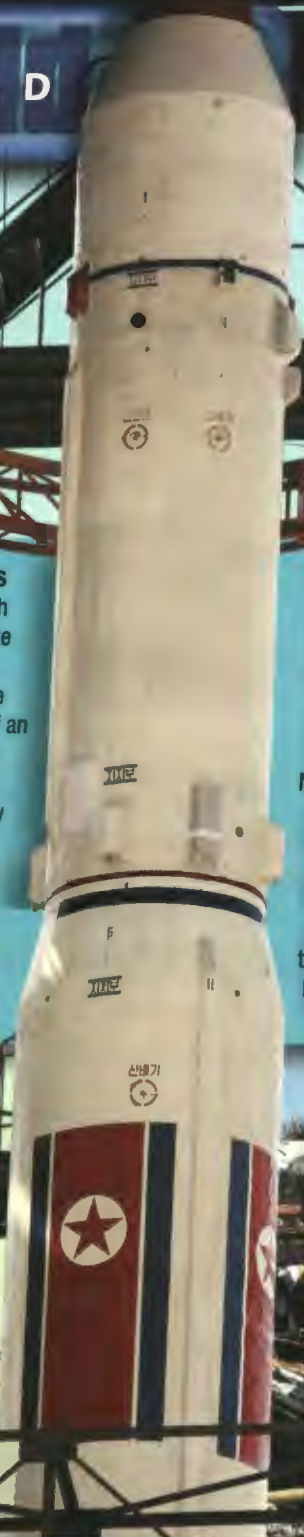


WORLD

▷ **ESCALATING TENSIONS**
In December 2012, North Korea launched a satellite rocket called Kwang-myŏngsŏng-3 Unit 2, the first successful launch of an Earth observation spacecraft by the Asian nation. It was quickly followed by backlash from other countries, however, given

that rocket technology is similar to ballistic missile technology, which is banned in North Korea. The United Nations Security Council adopted Resolution 2087 following this event, citing North Korea's violation. This led to ongoing tension between North and South Korea, the United States and Japan, as North Korea began to ignore previous agreements and threaten nuclear attacks under Kim Jong-Un's administration.

△ **PROGRESSIVE PRESIDENT** After allegations of voting irregularities and inauthentic results in previous elections, Iran changed their supervisory practices for the June 2013 election: A committee of eleven professionals were instituted to oversee the event for the first time in the country's history. Hassan Rouhani from the Moderation and Development Party, considered the most liberal candidate in the running, won in a landslide victory, capturing just over 50 percent of the vote. More than 36 million Iranians cast their ballots, a whopping 72.7 percent voter turnout.



△ **TYPHOON TERROR** For parts of Southeast Asia, November 2013 is a month that will live in infamy: Typhoon Haiyan, or Typhoon Yolanda as it was dubbed in the Philippines, was a cyclone that terrorized Micronesia, the Philippines, Southern China and Vietnam, claiming more than 6,200 lives; bodies were still being recovered as of January 2014. The damage is estimated at \$1.6 billion, and more than 16 million people have been affected. Homelessness and subsequent looting, as well as the threat of disease from poor living conditions, remain rampant. [George Calvelo/NurPhoto/REX (33772296)]



◁ **EGYPTIAN COUP D'ETAT** After four days of protests calling for the resignation of President Mohammed Morsi, Egyptian army chief General Abdel Fattah el-Sisi stepped in on July 3, 2013, to take action: He removed Morsi from power and suspended the constitution. An interim president, Chief Justice of the Supreme Constitutional Court of Egypt Adly Mansour, was instated. Global reception of the events has been mixed; some nations supported the military action while others strongly opposed the forceful removal (and subsequent house arrest) of Morsi. Protests both for and against the events are ongoing. (Keith Lane/NACT)



◁ **MASS CATASTROPHE** At 8:45 a.m. local time on April 24, 2013, an eight-story factory building in Savar, Bangladesh, collapsed, killing 1,129 people and injuring more than 2,500. The rescue efforts ended on May 13, after nearly three weeks of searching for survivors. The factory housed manufacturing for many North American retailers including Benetton, The Children's Place, Joe Fresh, Mango and Walmart. The companies have received criticism in the months since the accident – which is considered the worst garment-factory disaster ever – in terms of how working conditions and safety issues are monitored. △ **A STEP IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION** In September 2013, United States Secretary of State John Kerry made the suggestion that Syria dispense of all chemical weapons within a week. This was in response to chemical attacks in Ghouta, Syria, the previous month, to which the US and France were on the verge of executing air attacks on Syria in response. The suggestion from Kerry was surprisingly well received by Syrian and Russian governments, and Russia took a lead position in overseeing the elimination of Syria's chemical warfare. All of Syria's stockpiles should be eliminated by mid-2014. (AP Photo/John R. Kelly)

▽ **DEATH OF AN ICON** Nelson Mandela, the celebrated South African anti-apartheid revolutionary and former president of the nation, passed away on December 5, 2013, after a prolonged respiratory infection at the age of 95. Mandela, who was South Africa's first elected president in a fully democratic election, took on the country's biggest challenges: ingrained racism following the apartheid, poverty and inequality, leaving a legacy of peace and democracy the world over. Mandela's body lay in state for two days so citizens could pay their respects, and a state funeral, attended by top-ranking international representatives, was held on December 15. (AP Photo/Ben Cartl)

▽ **WORST NIGHTMARE** On September 21, 2013, up to sixteen unidentified gunmen took control of the Westgate shopping mall in Nairobi, Kenya. The attack lasted four days and at least 72 people were killed, including 61 civilians, six soldiers and five of the perpetrators. More than 175 people were injured. Islamist extremist group al-Shabaab took responsibility for the attack, citing Kenya's military presence in Somalia as the motive. A number of foreigners were counted among the victims. (AP Photo/Jonathan Kalan)



▷ **A CHANGE IN POPE** In February 2013, after almost eight years in the Roman Catholic Church's top position, Pope Benedict XVI resigned from the post. A papal enclave was held just weeks later, in March 2013, and a new pope, Pope Francis I, was elected on the second day. The Argentinian priest was born Jorge Mario Bergoglio, and was made a cardinal by Pope John Paul II in 2001. In the early days of his papacy, Pope Francis has been considered more open-minded on some of the church's doctrines. (giulio napoletano / Shutterstock.com)

◁ **WELCOME TO A FUTURE KING** Following months of Kate Middleton baby-bump-fashion spreads in every glossy magazine and on every entertainment show, the new heir to the throne made his entrance into the world, weighing 8 lbs, 6 oz, on July 22, 2013 at St. Mary's Hospital, London. The young Prince of Cambridge, who is officially named George Alexander Louis Windsor, was christened later in the year, on October 23, 2013, at the Royal Chapel at St. James's Palace (and the babe has seven godparents!). △ **MAYOR DRAMA** Polarizing Toronto mayor Rob Ford had a terrible year in 2013: From May to December, his constituents were time and again disappointed by his behaviour, which included everything from addictions issues and consorting with known criminals to sexual comments about his own wife. (The accusations started when two Toronto Star reporters were leaked a video showing Ford smoking crack cocaine, and the floodgates opened from there.) Global news outlets had a field day with the reported incidents, including jokes at Ford's expense on The Colbert Report, Saturday Night Live and The Daily Show with Jon Stewart. ◁ **IGNORANCE OR INCLINATION**

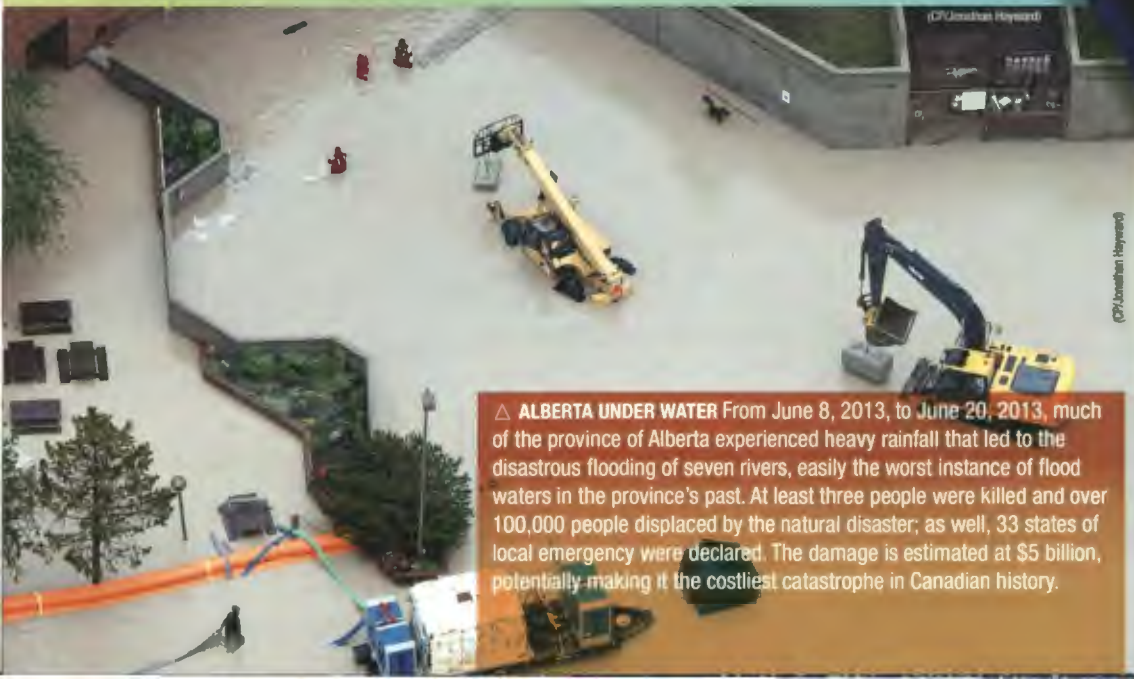
In September, as college and university students were gearing up for another year of classes, University of Toronto professor David Gilmour was raked over the coals for comments he made to *Hazlitt* magazine about his syllabus preferences. The 64-year-old writer said he wouldn't teach women or Chinese writers, prompting backlash from students, colleagues and the literary world at large. Gilmour says the only female writer he feels passionately about is Virginia Woolf, because he considers her a genius.

△ **UNAPPROVED CLAIMS** In late 2012, the Senate began to investigate expense claims made by a number of Senators, including Pamela Wallin, Mike Duffy, Mac Harb and Patrick Brazeau. The high-ranking officials were audited for ineligible claims, including excessive travel and housing costs, resulting in exorbitant tallies on the government's tab. Duffy, Wallin and Harb paid their debt to the Senate, and Harb eventually retired, but Duffy, Wallin and Brazeau were still suspended without pay and without most of their benefits in November 2013, after two weeks of deliberation. 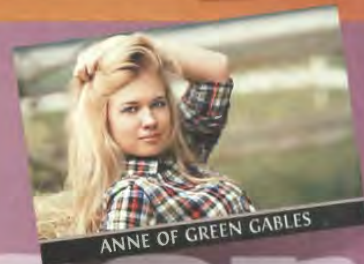
△ **ALBERTA UNDER WATER** From June 8, 2013, to June 20, 2013, much of the province of Alberta experienced heavy rainfall that led to the disastrous flooding of seven rivers, easily the worst instance of flood waters in the province's past. At least three people were killed and over 100,000 people displaced by the natural disaster; as well, 33 states of local emergency were declared. The damage is estimated at \$5 billion, potentially making it the costliest catastrophe in Canadian history.

◁ **HADFIELD GROUNDED** Astronaut Chris Hadfield, the first Canadian to walk in space, retired from the Canadian Space Agency (CSA) in July 2013 when he handed over command of the International Space Station (ISS). He is considered a member of the social media elite, with over 1 million Twitter followers and a popular Tumblr blog (Hadfield's son Evan manages his social media platforms). Musically inclined, Hadfield recorded a number of songs while on the ISS, including a video rendition of David Bowie's "Space Oddity," which now has over 21 million views on YouTube.

△ **TRAGEDY IN QUEBEC** In the wee hours of July 6, 2013, an unmanned freight train carrying a large shipment of crude oil derailed in the small town of Lac-Mégantic, Quebec, causing a major fire and a series of explosions that engulfed a one-kilometre radius; the heat from the devastating event was felt as far as two kilometres away. Forty-seven people were confirmed dead, and more than half of Lac-Mégantic's downtown core was destroyed. The derailment was the deadliest Canadian train disaster since 1864.



ANNE OF GREEN GABLES

△ **A BLONDE ANNE SHIRLEY?!** The fictional Canadian icon Anne of Green Gables is beloved for her red locks, her freckled cheeks, her quick wit and her spunky demeanour. She's recognizable internationally, and people from every corner of the world come in droves every year to visit her Prince Edward Island house. So imagine everyone's surprise when an edition of the first three books in the series, self-published on the Amazon CreateSpace platform, depicted a sexy blonde Anne instead of the well-known redhead. The edition was withdrawn as public anger heightened.

◁ **DIFFERENCE OF OPINION** In September 2013, the Parti Québécois officially proposed the Quebec Charter of Values to opposition from many of its contemporaries. The Charter, which would amend the Quebec Charter of Human Rights and Freedoms, enforce neutrality for all state officials, limit the wearing of religious symbols for public sector employees, and make it mandatory for citizens to have their faces uncovered when either providing or receiving a state service has been a source of discontent for many, but not all, Québécois. Protests have taken place both for and against the charter, and a documentary about the issue, entitled *Québec 60*, which was released in January 2014, has garnered more than 21,000 views to date. ▷ THE VOICE OF OUR TIME

When singer Rihanna was awarded the first-ever Icon Award at the American Music Awards — a prize “created to honor an artist whose body of work has made a profound influence over pop music on a global level” — a very special presenter bestowed the trophy: Rihanna’s mother, Monica Braithwaite. A montage of career highlights and a video message from Jay Z followed the accolade, and the emcee of the evening, Bill Maher, called the 26-year-old “the voice of our time.” (Ariana P. 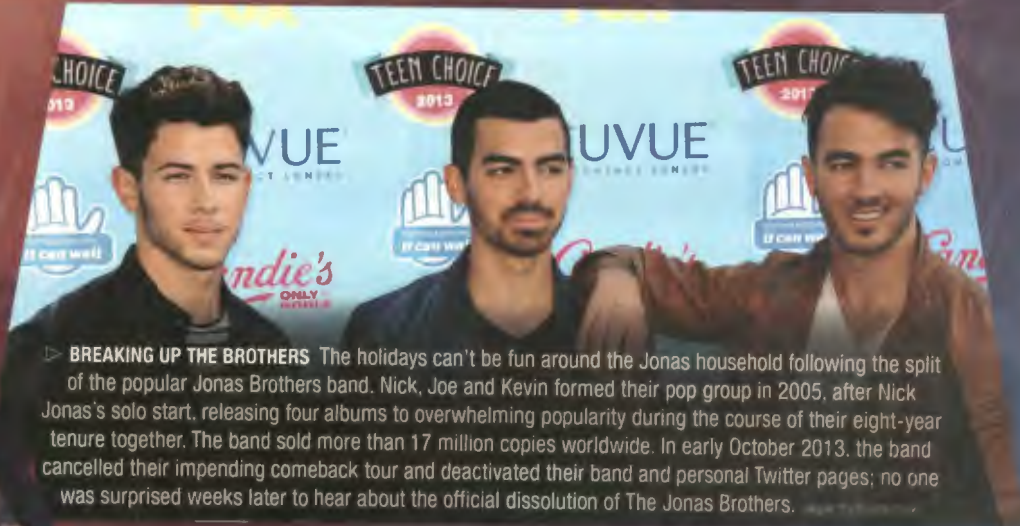

▽ **TOP OF HIS GAME** Justin Timberlake shows no signs of slowing down in his uber successful music and acting career: The 33-year-old (ridiculous, right?) shot two films in 2013 and released his third album in March 2013, called "The 20/20 Experience," as the first installment of a two-part project. The album debuted at number one in the United States, selling almost a million copies, cinching the best debut week of Timberlake's career. The 45-year-old mother of three released her 11th English language album, "Love Me Back to Life," in September 2013, her first English album since 2007. The record, which included a duet with Stevie Wonder, sold more than 1.3 million copies worldwide in the first three months and was the number one Canadian album of 2013.



△ **HI-HO SILVER?** Leave it to Lady Gaga to enter an awards ceremony in spectacular fashion. The 27-year-old artist arrived at the American Music Awards in November 2013 atop a large, white, human-operated horse (as evidenced by the horse's eight legs). Lady Gaga, who was born Stefani Joanne Angelina Germanotta and raised in New York City, is known for her avant-garde costume and theatrical choices, including a dress she wore in 2010 that was made entirely of meat.





▷ A BRAND NEW WORD

Oxford Dictionaries, the quintessential voice on all things English language, declared "selfie" the 2013 Word of the Year. Defined as "a photograph that one has taken of oneself, typically taken with a smartphone or webcam and uploaded to a social media website," the term "selfie" first appeared on an Australian blog in 2002, but with the help of a specialized research program, Oxford tracked an upswing in usage throughout 2013. "Selfie" has yet to be added to the Oxford Dictionary proper but can be found on OxfordDictionaries.com.

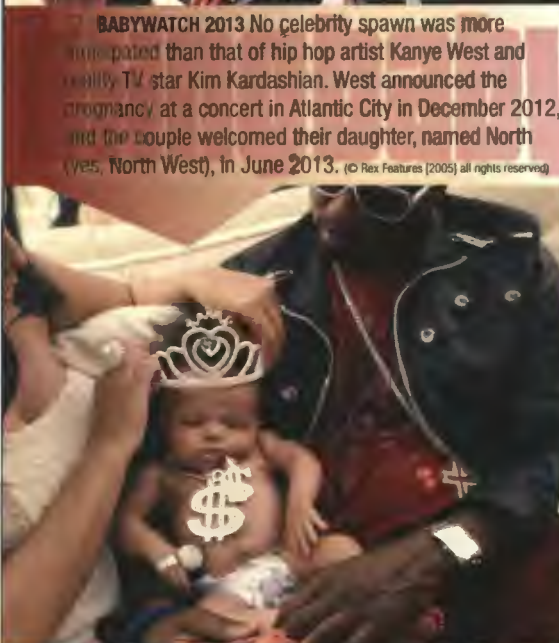

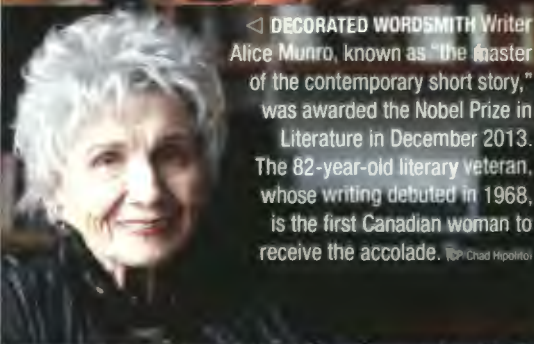

△ A PRETTY VOICE There's no disputing that Scarlett Johansson is a beauty who lights up the screen, but she wowed audiences with just her voice in the science fiction romantic drama *Her*. The film, with a star-studded cast including Joaquin Phoenix, Amy Adams and Rooney Mara, premiered at the New York Film Festival in December 2013 and the nominations started rolling in from there. Director-producer Spike Jonze took home the Oscar for Best Original Screenplay in March 2014.

▷ A NEW CLASSIC In the vein of Disney musicals gone by, *Frozen* was released in November 2013 to rave reviews. The 53rd animated movie in Disney's arsenal of animated masterpieces has an all-star voice cast — including Idina Menzel as Princess Elsa and Kristen Bell as Elsa's younger sister, Anna — and a musical score that gives goosebumps. The movie took home Best Animated Feature and Best Original Song ("Let It Go") at the Academy Awards in March 2014.

STANLEY GOES TO CHICAGO

The Chicago Blackhawks took home the NHL's top prize for the second time in four years in June 2013. The Blackhawks defeated the Boston Bruins in six games — with the Cup-winning goal scored by Dave Bolland with just 58 seconds left in game six, breaking the record for latest Stanley Cup game winner scored in regulation time. ◀ **UNPRECEDENTED DEAL**
In a massive business deal between Rogers Communications Inc. and the National Hockey League, the telecommunications titan now holds the exclusive rights to more than 500 regular-season NHL games in the 2014-2015 season. The games will be broadcast across 13 networks, with viewers having a choice of as many as seven matchups to choose from on a Saturday night. The Eastern Conference semifinals were within spitting distance for Toronto Maple Leafs fans. But after tying up the quarter-final series — a feat in itself, considering they were down three games to none — the Leafs blew a 4-1 lead over the Boston Bruins in Game 7, in what was one of the most heart-breaking losses in franchise history. ▷ **NO FEAR** Diana Nyad, an American long-distance swimmer, is a fighter: At age 64, and on her fifth attempt, Nyad became the first person to swim from Havana, Cuba, to Key West, Florida, without a shark cage (though she did wear a silicone mask, a full body suit, gloves and booties to protect her from jellyfish). Accompanied by a team of 35 support people, the 110 mi journey took the senior citizen swimmer 53 hours.



▷ **THE COMEBACK KID** Rafael Nadal, the Spanish tennis phenom, seemed to have seen the peak of his career: After a stunning run at every major tennis tournament, against every worthy opponent, Nadal was forced to pull out of the 2012 Olympics due to injury, as well as the Rogers Cup, the Cincinnati Masters and the US Open. By the end of 2012, he was ranked fourth in the world — a career low for the 27-year-old. But Nadal turned it around in 2013, much to the surprise of the tennis community, winning the French Open and the US Open. By the end of the season, he was again on top of the international rankings.



▶ **HOT, HOT, HOT**
From February 3 to March 25, 2013, the Miami Heat was unstoppable. Winning 27 straight games, the second-longest streak of any NBA team in league history, the Heat went on to capture the league championship for the second year in a row. Formed in 1988 as one of four expansion teams, the franchise is now worth an estimated \$770 million and remains a force on the court.



SCIENCE

▽ **DNA DISCOVERY** And you thought your grandpa was old. Scientists have uncovered the oldest documented human DNA, in Sima de los Huesos, or "pit of bones," in Northern Spain. It's clear that the 400,000-year-old specimen is not a direct descendent of humans today – it's likely a relative of the Neanderthal or the Denisovan species – but the surprising part is that most Denisovan remains were previously found in Siberia, a long, long way from Spain.

◁ **CANCER BREAKTHROUGH** It turns out that our own immune systems may be able to help in the fight against cancer. Scientists have long surmised that the best treatment for some cancers lies in the body itself: The treatment requires the engineering of tumor cells to essentially turn on themselves and then reinfusing the modified T cells back into the patient. This groundbreaking therapy received encouragement this year when in a study of 1800 melanoma patients treated with this technique, 22% were alive three years later. It doesn't work for everyone, though, and it's still difficult to treat metastatic cancer, but it's a step in the cure direction. (Andrea Danti/Shutterstock)

◁ **GETTING CLARITY** Scientists at Stanford University in California have combined neuroscience with chemical engineering to achieve a feat on par with superhero powers: They have figured out how to make a postmortem brain transparent for the purpose of studying the organ's structures and wiring. (Previously, the brain had to be sectioned to be studied, which ruins the integrity of the whole.) The process, involving chemical and light treatment, is called CLARITY and could potentially be used on other organs as well. (courtesy of the Deisseroth lab)

▷ **UNHAPPY MILESTONE** In May 2013, greenhouse gas in the environment reached a level not seen for millions of years. The levels of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere reached 400 parts per million, which should serve as a warning for the world's population in terms of climate change. The rise in CO₂ is 75 times faster than in pre-industrial times, which may mean catastrophic consequences for future generations.

▷ SPACE ON EARTH

In November 2013, the journal *Science* published the results from an international scientific collaboration that detected 28 high-energy extraterrestrial neutrinos in Antarctica. Astrophysicists are fascinated by the discovery of the neutrinos, which were likely created by the same force in deep space that creates extremely high radiation called cosmic rays. ▽ ◁ SERIOUS HOPE

After more than ten years and a number of failed attempts, researchers at Oregon Health & Science University and the Oregon National Primate Research Center announced in May that they had successfully cloned human embryonic cells. The skin cells were successfully grown into stem cells, which could mean amazing strides for those requiring organ transplants.
